
Elements that can personalize a costume.

Fringe a series of strings or pieces of fabric hanging from clothing		Fur or Animal Print		Embroidery designs or pictures on fabric made with thread		Leather Tooling leather that has been decorated using tools, usually in a raised texture and design			
Smile Pockets curved, angled pocket with piping on the edges		Rhinestones		Ruffles
